# Book Level, Target Audience, and Justification for CWK Book 1

#### 1. Level of the Book

Overall Level: Beginner (A1 on the CEFR scale)

Language Focus:

#### Age Group:

- Young learners (ages 6-9) who are beginning English learners
- Elementary school students at basic English proficiency (A1)

# English Proficiency Level:

A1 learners who are starting to build sentence structure and vocabulary knowledge

#### Purpose of Use:

- Building foundational reading skills through short, repetitive texts
- Developing basic sentence patterns using structured grammar exercises
- Strengthening early vocabulary acquisition with theme-based learning units

#### 3. Justification for Level and Audience

- The book introduces English through simple, structured sentences, making it ideal for beginner-level learners. Topics focus on daily life and familiar concepts (e.g., family, seasons, school, hobbies), ensuring easy comprehension.
- Sentence structures are basic and repetitive, reinforcing fundamental grammar.
- Vocabulary lists and diagramming exercises provide explicit guidance for sentence formation.

### 2. For Self-Study

- Use vocabulary tests as self-check guizzes.
- Practice writing simple sentences using sentence-building exercises.

#### 3. For Level Placement

- If a student scores 0-10 points, they need more foundational practice (pre-A1 level materials recommended).
- If a student scores 11-20 points, they are at the beginner level (A1, can continue with Book 1 with extra support).
- If a student scores 21-30 points, they are at the A1+ level and can move on to CWK Book 2.
